CONFERENCE PURPOSE


This conference was about providing adaptable and ergonomic educational furniture solutions to create agile learning environments that address students' physical needs.

Dr. Dieter Breithecker – Health and Kinetics Scientist and the President of Federal Institute on the Development of Posture and Movement in Germany.






SPEAKERS (CONTINUED)

- Students need 4 C's in a learning environment:
 - 1. Creativity
 - 2. Communication
 - 3. Critical Thinking
 - 4. Collaboration



- There are two more C's that are also a must for a successful learning environment:
 - CHOICE and COMFORT
- Continuous and repeated professional development is needed around how to use the furniture to foster a successful learning environment



- Students need to move in order to emit positive emotion and this is done through motion
- Posture changes bring about motion which releases a bio-chemical reaction to positive emotion
- Sitting still slows brain activity, which leads to foggy thinking and distraction
- Learning is messy

Busy body, busy mind



- We need to satisfy the requirements of all learning styles while also allowing choice.
- 50% of your learning day or working day should be sitting in a chair and the other 50% standing
- Chairs should allow for leaning back, tilting forward, and moving around for spontaneous, intuitive body motion.

NEXT STEPS



- 4 elementary furniture pilot classrooms being installed over the holiday break
- Focus PD for pilot teachers on utilizing classroom furniture to support the learning environment also includes book "P.B. Disrupts School"
- Make pilot classrooms available to staff and community
