Process Overview

- MiPHY is an online, anonymous student survey developed by Michigan Department of Education (MDE) in collaboration with the Michigan Department of Community Health.
- Switched from 40 Developmental Assets Survey in 2008 to MiPHY.
- Lake Orion participated in 2008 and again in 2010. MiPHY is offered every "EVEN" year to all Michigan schools.
- Data is relevant to alcohol, tobacco and other drug use, violence, nutrition, sexual behaviors, physical behaviors and family/community domains.
- Survey was administered to all students in grades 7, 9, and 11 at Lake Orion Community Schools.

A TEEN WHO FIRST USES ALCOHOL OR DRUGS AT AGE 15 IS 4-5 TIMES AS LIKELY TO DEVELOP A SUBSTANCE USE DISORDER (SUD) AS ONE WHO WAITS UNTIL HE/SHE IS 21

AGE 1ST USE OF ALCOHOL <14 yo (vs. 21 yo)

- 4 ½ times more likely to develop a SUD
- 7 times more likely to be in MVA
- 12 times more likely to be injured
- 11 times more likely to be in physical fight
- 3 times more likely to attempt suicide
- Strong Predictor of Rx Drug Misuse (Hermos 2008)
- When develop a SUD, it's more severe and develops much faster

Risk Indicators:

D and F students are at a greater risk and more likely to smoke cigarettes (lifetime) and during the past 30 days, chew more tobacco, smoke cigars (lifetime and in the last 30 days), drink alcohol (including binge drinking more) and use marijuana, club drugs, prescription drugs and painkillers more frequently than A and B students. More D and F students carry weapons and have done so in the last 30 days.

Risk Indicators: Tobacco

- The percentage of students using any form of tobacco is high (26% compared to the state average of 24.8%) among 11th grade students surveyed (18.4% for 7th grade).
- The percentage of students who purchased/stole their own tobacco from a store/parents, even though they are NOT 18 years old (28.4%) is close to double the state average of 15% (20% 7th grade).

Marijuana and Other Drugs

- Marijuana usage increases substantially as students get older. The percentage of students who ever tried marijuana in their lifetime goes from 3.2% in 7th grade to 15.9% in 9th to 38.3% in 11th.

Marijuana and Other Drugs

- Over 8.4% of all (9th and 11th grade) students took prescription painkillers (such as: Vicodin, Demerol) without a doctor's prescription one or more times during the past 30 days.

- Among 11th grade students surveyed, 9.7% took a prescription drug (such as: Xanax, Ritalin) without a doctor's prescription one or more times during the past 30 days.
- 221 (23 7th, 74 9th, 124 11th) students indicated they were offered, sold or given an illegal drug on school property in the last 12 months.

School Domain

- Over 60% of our students surveyed reported that they did not receive praise from teachers when they work hard.
- 38% of our 9th and 11th grade students reported that they often or almost always hated being at school during the past year.
- A large percentage of students feel that the school does not report to parents when they have done something well.

 (27.3% of 9th & 11th graders and 42.4% of 7th graders said the school lets parents know)

Community Domain

- Students report that it is easy to acquire cigarettes, alcohol and marijuana. All the students reported that alcohol was the easiest to obtain.
- Students report that very few neighbors notice when they are doing a good job and let them know. The older the students the less they are recognized.
