School News

The Orion Schools opened Tuesday Sept. 2nd and now have a record enrollment of 260. The enrollment in the different grades is as follows:—Kindergarten 22, 1st grade 23, 2nd grade 21, 3rd grade 22, 4th grade 36, 5th grade 14 6th grade 24, 7th grade 24, 8th grade 18, 9th grade 13, 10th grade 22, 11th grade 10, 12th grade 11.

Just fourteen boys out for foot ball this season. The outlook is not very bright but the boys are going through with their schedule nevertheless.
