## School News

The Orion Schools opened Tuesday Sept. 2nd and now have a record enrollment of 260. The enrollment in the different grades is as follows:—Kindergarten 22, 1st grade 23, 2nd grade 21, 3rd grade 22, 4th grade 36, 5th grade 14, 6th grade 24, 7th grade 24, 8th grade 18, 9th grade 13, 10th grade 22, 11th grade 10, 12th grade 11.

Very crowded conditions exist in the 3rd and 4th grade room where Miss Sims has to supervise the instruction of 58 pupils.

Although there is a record enrollment the eleventh grade of ten pupils, is just half as large as it was last June. This is due mostly to the fact that several pupils have gone to the Pontiac schools.

The Hi-Y Club held its first meeting of the season and elected officers: Frank Gilmore—President, Warren Squires—Vice-President, George Schick—Secretary and Treasurer, Kenneth Wilson—chaplain. Mr. Wolf will be the Hi-Y leader during the year.

Miss Beed, music and art teacher will lead the High School Orchestra. Orchestra music has been ordered.

Just fourteen boys out for foot ball this season. The outlook is not very bright but the boys are going through with their schedule nevertheless.

Teachers and pupils will appreciate an occasional visit by parents.
