A CITIZEN'S GUIDE TO SELECTING A LAWN SERVICE FOR WATERSHED PROTECTION

Polluted stormwater runoff caused from rain and melting snow carrying pollutants from the streets, sidewalks and lawns is one of the biggest threats to water quality. Lawn fertilizer and pesticides are among the pollutants found in stormwater runoff. By choosing a lawn care provider that is mindful of water quality, you are helping to protect your local waters.



TIPS FOR HIRING A LANDSCAPE OR LAWN MAINTENANCE PROFESSIONAL

- 1. Before contracting for landscape (or any) work, ask for references, go look at the work, follow up and talk with the owners to ensure their satisfaction with the business relationship.
- 2. Get the contract, guarantees/warranties in writing.
- 3. Ask if they carry insurances for general liability, vehicles, workers compensation, and unemployment. Under certain circumstances the owner could be liable for accidents occurring on his/her property if the contractor is not insured.
- 4. Do they have the appropriate local business licenses? A state Nursery Handlers License (required for anyone handling nursery stock)? A pesticide applicators license for pesticide spraying?
- 5. Is their equipment well maintained?
- 6. Be absolutely clear about the terms of payment and the date of completion.
- Make certain the company office address and phone number are on the document/contract and know the name of the representative or designer who worked with you.

Participating lawn care companies typically offer *Healthy Lawn Care Program for Watershed Protection* as an option for their customers.

The MGIA Healthy Lawn Care Program includes:

- An initial on-site consultation/assessment
- Soil nutrient tests offered to new customers
- No phosphorous or low-phosphorous fertilizer in accordance with state law
- Slow-release nitrogen fertilizer (40% in slow-release form)
- Advice to the customer on proper maintenance practices such as mowing and irrigation
- Fertilizer quantities of two, three, or four pounds per 1000 square feet, applied over the growing season
- Weed control
 - zero pesticides
 - spot-treatment for weeds and/or
 - one-time rescue operation for weed control

CRWC'S 10 TIPS FOR WATERSHED FRIENDLY LAWNS AND GARDENS!

- **1.Sweep it**—make sure excess fertilizer is swept off of pavement and onto the grass.
- **2.Mow high. Mow sharp**—ideal height is 3in or higher; make sure to keep the blade sharp.
- 3.Make your turf tough—aerate, leave clippings, select grass varieties wisely.
- **4.Water wisely**—do not over water; keep sprinklers off during rainfall; keep water on grass.
- 5.Don't guess, soil test—test soil for needed nutrients and fertilize accordingly.
- **6.Buy low. Buy slow**—use products with low or no phosphorous and slow release nitrogen.
- **7.Apply wisely**—do not fertilize before a heavy rain and avoid over fertilizing.
- **8.Create a shoreline buffer**—If you live on a body of water, do not mow to the edge.
- **9.Go native, go natural**—plant native species; use natural pest controls; compost.
- 10.Make stormwater work for you—install rain gardens & rain barrels.
