Oakview Middle School Annual Education Report (AER)

April 1, 2019

Dear Parents and Community Members:

We are pleased to present you with the Annual Education Report (AER) which provides key information on the 2017-2018 educational progress for Oakview Middle School. The AER addresses the complex reporting information required by federal and state laws. The school's report contains information about student assessment, accountability and teacher quality. For the 2017-18 school year, schools were identified using new definitions and labels as required in the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). A Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI) school is one that has at least one underperforming student subgroup. An Additional Targeted Support (ATS) school is one that has three or more underperforming student subgroups. A Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) school is one whose performance is in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state or has a graduation rate at or below 67%. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases, no label is given.

*Note TSI and ATS definitions were changed for the 2018-19 school year per federal requirements. The new definitions are:

TSI – The school has at least one subgroup performing in the bottom 25% within each applicable accountability index component.

ATS – The school has met the criteria for TSI identification and has at least one subgroup performing at the same level as a CSI school.

Our school was identified as a Targeted Support and Improvement school.

The staff at Oakview Middle School is dedicated to educating all students in a way that helps meet their ever changing academic and social emotional needs. One of our biggest challenges at Oakview is ensuring that our at-risk population is equipped with the tools necessary to be successful at the next level. Another challenge is to maintain our high level of achievement while balancing the social and emotional needs of all learners. Lastly, we continue to push forward on new initiatives to enhance the learning experience, both academically and socially, as well as keeping the culture of our school a top priority. An additional challenge is to maintain our high level of achievement, as we proceed to a more standards-based grading and reporting system. Although the research behind such grading and reporting strategies is well known, making the shift can be difficult for all stakeholders. Through PD, staff meetings, and research our staff has made impressive steps towards developing a hybrid standards based model that will work for all middle level schools in LOCS.

State law requires that we also report additional information.

Description of Oakview Middle and Student Enrollment

Oakview Middle is one of three middle schools within Lake Orion Community Schools. Each middle school provides enrollment only to those students living within the school's boundary. Oakview Middle houses grades 6-8 in which students are assigned to teams for their core academic classes (Science, Social Studies, Math and Language Arts). Throughout their three years in middle school, students develop new areas of interest through a variety of exploratory and elective classes including modern languages, art, computer applications, and physical education. Oakview Middle offers a wide range of clubs, sports, intramural activities and extracurricular activities. Oakview Middle School was designated as a Title I school for the 2017-18 school year.

Lake Orion Community Schools has expanded its Schools-of-Choice enrollment program to include out-of-district students for the 2017-18 school year. Spaces were available at selected elementary and middle schools (K-8) during the 2017-18 school year. Lake Orion also accepted Schools-of-Choice students in our Learning Options High School, an alternative learning environment for students in grades 10-12.

School Improvement

The Board of Education authorizes and supports the formation of building level school improvement committees at each building within the district. The Oakview Middle School Improvement Committee is comprised of teachers from each grade level, the principal, and parent representatives. The purpose of this committee is to establish a purpose statement and goals for Oakview Middle School and to oversee the programs and activities leading toward the attainment of those goals. Building level decisions are made regarding curriculum, school improvement, staff development and evaluation as determined by this committee. School Improvement is a continuous process at Oakview Middle School. Building School Improvement Plans are reviewed annually and submitted to the State. Through our analysis, we see a great improvement in our achievement and see a trend in reducing the achievement gap.

Goals:

- Goal 1: All students at Oakview Middle School will increase student growth in content area of reading and writing.
- Goal 2: All students at Oakview Middle School will increase student growth in science content knowledge.
- Goal 3: All students at Oakview Middle School will increase student growth in the math content area.
- Goal 4: All students at Oakview Middle School will increase student growth in social studies content area knowledge.

Specialized Schools

Oakview is Lake Orion's newest middle school. Oakview was designed by a committee of parents, staff members and students to meet the unique educational needs of middle level students. Our curriculum and programs create a true middle school environment focused on educating the whole child within the team concept and providing opportunities to explore and expand interests.

Our school district provides educational programs, services and support to certified special education students throughout the District. During the 2017-18 school year, there were 872 students who were in need of special education support services. From this group, 12 students required specialized services outside of the Lake Orion school district. Those students attended Waterford, Birmingham, and Bloomfield Hills School Districts. Oakview Middle School has one classroom that services emotionally impaired students.

Curriculum

Lake Orion Community Schools continues to implement a comprehensive curriculum for all students. The curriculum is based on and aligns with Michigan Standards for all courses and subject matter, and state-mandated graduation requirements. Local Assessments

At Oakview Middle we use a variety of qualitative and quantitative methods (in addition to M-STEP) to assess the whole child. Students are assessed both formally and informally in all classes using a variety of instruments including projects, performances and technology based presentations. FastBridge and common assessments in mathematics, language arts, science and social studies are administered to all students.
