Grade Level:	Developmental Kindergarten
Week of:	April 13, 2020

Content Area	Activities
Literacy	<p>Each listed activity should last approximately 20 minutes or less</p> <p>Activity 1: Read! Pick 4 of your favorite books to read today. Tell a family member about which picture you liked the best and why.</p> <p>Activity 2: Magazine Collage! Cut out letters from store ads or magazines. Match the letters or build a word with the letter. Or simply make a beautiful collage with cut out letters.</p> <p>Activity 3: Mystery Write! Write the letters or character names with a white crayon or pencil. Then paint over it with watercolor to make it appear.</p>
Math	<p>Each listed activity should last approximately 20 minutes or less</p> <p>Activity 1: Sort by color and size (cars, dolls, Legos, crayons, jewelry, buttons, etc.) If you have lots of items that are different, then sort by type too!</p> <p>Activity 2: Go on a shape walk either inside or outside. Find a shape, say what shape it is, and describe the shape. Make a list of the shapes you see and count how many you see of each shape.</p> <p>Activity 3: Shaving cream write and draw. Draw numbers and shapes in shaving cream.</p>
Social Interaction	<p>Each listed activity should last approximately 20 minutes or less</p> <p>Activity 1: Cereal Necklace. Make a necklace with cereal then ask if you can eat it as a snack. Make another to share with a family member.</p> <p>Activity 2: Cutting Collage. Make a collage with the tiny pieces from a cutting bin. Construction paper, straws, colorful tissue paper, etc. Hang to display for your family to enjoy. Describe what you see.</p>

	Activity 3: Homemade Watercolors. Place a marker in a cup of water. Paint with the watercolors. Display and describe your artwork for your family to enjoy! Be sure to add your name since you're the artist!
Art	<p>Activity 1: Enjoy watching these Lego characters help review primary and secondary colors! https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=mNwaujZAZ_0</p> <p>Draw a toy train with this drawing video.</p> <p>https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=CV6yfaiF-Js&feature=youtu.be</p> <p>Activity 2: Pick out your favorite toy. When you look at it, can you name some of the lines, shapes, colors and textures you see? Do you see any patterns? Once you finish observing your toy, try to draw it, including the lines, shapes, colors and textures you saw.</p>
Media	<p>Each year the month of April is set aside as National Poetry Month, a time to celebrate poets and their craft. Poetry is considered an art form. It can be beautiful to both read and listen to. Some studies show that poetry is healthy for our bodies.</p> <p>Activity 1: Read, color and/or share the poems provided in the first library/media document that is attached. (1 of 2)</p> <p>Activity 2: Read and share the poems provided on the websites described in second library/media document that is attached. (2 of 2) For example: https://www.starfall.com/h/ftr-poetry/?sn=fun-to-read (No account needed)</p>
Music	<p>Activity 1: Go to https://pbskids.org/daniel/games/music-shop and hand the character an instrument from the wall to hear it play. What instrument is your favorite? Email your music teacher and let them know!</p> <p>Activity 2: Use materials around your house to create a musical instrument. You could either draw your instrument or create it using cardboard, tape, rubber bands, string, etc! What did you name your instrument? What vibrates (wiggles) on your instrument making the sound? Can the pitch go up and down on your instrument? How do you make the sound change? Send a picture or video to your music teacher!</p>
Physical Education	<p>Activity 1: Chalk Time - Using chalk, create a pathway on your driveway (you can do this inside also with string instead). Designate starts and stops that make you change how you move. You could start with running then switch to skipping, galloping, hopping...you get the idea. Add breaks in the line that encourage big leaps or jumps to continue.</p>

	<p>Activity 2: Treasure Map Crawl - Have one of your parents hide a treasure in the house and then draw a map to find the hidden treasure. You must crawl (baby, crab or bear) and follow the map to find the treasure. Now it's your turn to hide it and draw the map!</p> <p>Activity 3: Inner focus - There is a lot going on right now. Take a moment as a family to simply sit, close your eyes and focus on your breath (no talking). Set a timer. At first you may only be able to do this for one minute and you may feel silly at first, stick with it. Let yourself focus on something that brings you joy, think only of that until the timer goes off. Do this a couple times a day, increasing your timer with each focus session. See if you can build up to 5 minutes.</p>
