WELCOME

Welcome to Learning Options High School. We are here to give students educational OPTIONS! We understand that all students are unique and a traditional approach to education may not be best for every student. Our school is an alternative education program within Lake Orion Community Schools that is designed to work with students and parents to customize a learning plan that is best for each individual.

Our goal is to help students successfully progress toward timely graduation by creating an optimal learning environment, implementing effective, research-based instruction, and building positive relationships. We also believe in educating the whole student—academically, socially, emotionally, and behaviorally. We focus on helping each student create individual goals and plans to be successful in post-secondary paths including college, apprenticeships, military service, or immediate career.

At Learning Options High School, we will create an educational plan that is individualized for each student with graduation as the ultimate goal. Each student’s schedule will be tailored to specifically meet their unique needs. Most of our students are most successful when they are scheduled in our face-to-face courses with our specialized teachers during the typical school day. However, there are some students who find success in virtual learning courses where they receive academic instruction through an online learning environment which is primarily off-campus. They are able to self-schedule their learning and have control over the time, location, and pace of their education. Our responsibility is to work with each student to find the perfect environment and instructional method that meets each student’s needs and promotes success.

Approximately 100 students attend Learning Options High School each year. Our dedicated staff includes six highly qualified teachers, two learning support staff members, a social worker, a paraprofessional, a secretary, and a supervisor. Together, we believe that successful students actively engage in academics, have exceptional attendance, and exhibit appropriate, responsible behaviors. Therefore, all students and staff at Learning Options High School participate in the Successful Student Mentor Program where we develop these skills while developing positive, nurturing and supportive relationships.

Students at Learning Options High School meet all of the requirements of the Michigan Merit Curriculum and earn a diploma from Lake Orion Community Schools. Our students are also able to participate in elective courses offered at the Oakland Technical Campus and Lake Orion High School. All extracurricular activities and events at LOHS including sports, clubs, and the fine arts are also available for Learning Options students who wish to participate.

We are proud that our district, through this program, can provide students an environment where they realize their unlimited potential. Learning Options students must earn between 22 and 30 credits that meet the Michigan Merit High School Graduation requirements. Staff will work with each student to determine the minimum required amount of credits required for graduation. Once complete, students earn a high school diploma from Lake Orion Community Schools.

SUCCESSFUL STUDENT MENTORING PROGRAM

Successful students at Learning Options High School actively engage in **academics**, have exceptional **attendance**, and are **accountable** for appropriate, responsible student behaviors. All students are matched with an adult staff member. Each week, students meet with their mentors and review the Successful Student Rubric (SSR). Based on their reports, students will earn a “successful week” or “unsuccessful week.” The goal is to develop positive, nurturing, and supportive relationships while developing school accountability. Students who earned a successful week will be eligible to participate in “Friday Fun.” Students who did not meet goals will be required to attend “Extra Support Class.” Through this multi-tiered intervention and reward system, students find success.

Academics: In order to maintain enrollment in the program, students must make progress towards graduation (earn credit). Full-time students will be enrolled in a total of 7 credits per academic year. **ANY** loss of credit in **ANY** class in a single term may result in the student being placed on academic probation. Failure to meet the terms of their academic probation will be considered a permanent withdrawal from the Learning Options Program.

Attendance: It is the expectation that students are present every day of instruction. Please call the office if your son or daughter is going to be late, absent, or needs to leave early. The nature of our program is that most work is done in class. Students with excessive absences will be placed on an attendance contract. Tardiness is a disruption of the learning environment; habitual tardiness shows a lack of respect for the other students in the class and will be viewed as insubordination. Learning Options is a closed campus. Students may not leave the CERC building during the school day without administrator approval. Failure to adhere to the policy will be considered a permanent withdrawal from Learning Options High School.

Accountable Actions: Students will demonstrate respect and conduct themselves in a manner appropriate for a school setting. Behavior that interferes with the learning environment, including insubordination, loud and/or abusive speech, and antagonistic or threatening behavior, will result in immediate suspension and possible expulsion from Learning Options High School. **All students are responsible for knowing the policies of Lake Orion Community Schools.** Students are accountable for any actions that violate the Student Code of Conduct as outlined by the district in the student handbook.

SOCIAL EMOTIONAL LEARNING

Positivity Project

Positivity Project is a course designed to enhance each student’s capacity to integrate skills, attitudes, and behaviors to deal effectively with daily tasks and challenges. Most Learning Options students are enrolled in this course during the school year. Our goal is to create citizens and leaders who will enhance our communities and country by internalizing the belief that “Other People Matter.” Positive psychology teaches that people have all 24 strengths within them, and that character is not just skills or behaviors, but rather an intrinsic part of each of us.

Positivity Project focuses on five core competencies:

1. Self-awareness
2. Self-management
3. Social awareness
4. Relationship skills
5. Responsible decision-making

SUCCESSFUL STUDENT COURSE

Successful Student is an elective course that the majority of Learning Options students will be scheduled in. The class meets during 1st hour on Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday and consists of the following activities in a rotating schedule:

- Current Events—Ms. Hornbeck
- Career and College Readiness—Ms. Smith
- STEM—Ms. Bulat
- Psychology 101 & Me—Ms. Yearby
- Xello—students will transform their aspirations into personalized plans for academic and career success
- Edgenuity—individualized virtual learning to extend knowledge or meet graduation requirements
- SSR Successful Student Program—weekly meeting with a mentor
- Friday Fun—extended learning activities based on student interest and choice
- ESC—extra support class for students needing additional help in a course

DIGITAL LEARNING

Digital learning is a method of receiving academic instruction in courses through a digital/online learning environment. Learning Options High School uses courses through Edgenuity. Learning Options teachers are responsible for managing the course content, grading assignments, and ensuring success in the program. Edgenuity is available at: www.edgenuity.com.

- Edgenuity is an online curriculum that students work on during the school day in a lab setting with teacher support to complete courses that are required for graduation.
- At any one time, numerous students are able to work on different courses, all in the same classroom.
- Edgenuity also allows students to work at their own pace and accomplish their personal goals each day.

VIRTUAL LEARNING

Virtual Learning courses are available through Learning Options High School. However, we encourage parents to consider carefully if a 100% virtual course is ideal for their student given the fact that they will be forfeiting face-to-face teacher classroom instruction and support. Parents should carefully consider the unique qualities of their student when investigating if an online class is right for them. These factors include:

- Can your student create and maintain a study schedule without face-to-face interaction of a teacher?
- Can your student self-advocate seeking help within a virtual setting?
- Does your student possess the independent study habits needed to complete an entire course online without daily supervision?
- Does your student have the reading, writing, math, and computer literacy skills to succeed in a class that is completely online?

It is important to note that this option is limited to choices available within the state online course catalog (<https://micourses.org>). While all of these classes have been reviewed from each sponsoring local district, these courses may not necessarily meet the rigor of courses for LOCS from a credit or graduation requirement perspective and are, therefore, subject to administrative approval. Additionally, availability of courses is not guaranteed. Courses may have a class size limit, and should that limit be exceeded, students will be placed into the course on a lottery basis.

The Virtual Learning Lab is held within Learning Options High School for high school students taking any type of virtual course, including credit recovery and credit forward. The lab provides computer access as well as proctoring of unit assessments and exams.

EXTRA SUPPORT CLASS (ESC)

TIME-IN

“Time In” is a form of intervention in which the student attends school, but is held out of regular classes, for the purpose of taking action to repair the harm caused by negative behavior. “Time In” will be used at the administrator’s discretion.

CERC BUILDING ENTRANCE & VISITORS

Students not arriving on the bus, as well as any visitors, must enter the CERC building through the north entrance (closest to the football stadium). The north entrance is monitored and open from 7:00 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. daily.

PARKING PASS

Students are required to have a parking pass if they would like to drive to school. Our students park in the “sophomore lot” which is located on the northwest side of the CERC building. BUS TRANSPORTATION

Students who live in-district will be provided bus transportation from their home to Lake Orion High School in the morning and from Lake Orion High School to their home in the afternoon. There is also a bus that shuttles students from LOHS to CERC and back, including OSTC students. This bus shuttle is located at the front of the LOHS bus loop in the morning and at the CERC bus loop in the afternoon.
